



Maulden Wood & Heath



Maulden Wood, which includes Maulden Heath, is a varied landscape with so much to explore.

Maulden wood is a semi-natural broadleaf woodland that remains green for most of the year due to the large number of pine and evergreen trees. To the north you will find the largest remaining area of ancient woodland in Bedfordshire. The southern end is home to an area sometimes referred to as Pennyfather's Wood. Maulden Wood also contains Maulden Heath, which consists of fields of grassland and heath managed by traditional grazing. It is home to a variety of plants and insects and is designated as a Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI).

Whether it is on foot, bike or horseback, there is so much to discover at Maulden Wood and you'll be amazed at the abundance of wildlife. Look out for the amazing display of flowers in spring, the rare butterflies, badgers and foxes. Listen out for birdlife and enjoy the tranquillity as you explore this beautiful landscape.
